## Big Data's First No. 1

**Big Data** gets its first No. 1 on a U.S. chart as debut hit "Dangerous" (featuring **Joywave**) rises 2-1 on Alternative. The track collected 2,132 detections at the format in the week ending Aug. 3 (up 5 percent), according to Nielsen BDS.

*Billboard* tipped Big Data (fronted by **Alan Wilkis**, above) as an artist to watch in the March 15 edition of the Bubbling Under column. After both KROQ Los Angeles and Sirius XM's Alt Nation championed the track, the song started gaining traction with more outlets, leading to Big Data signing with Warner Bros. Records in July. A full-length album is due later this year.

Elsewhere on Alternative, **Weezer's** "Back to the Shack" jumps into the top 10 in just its second chart week (12-10; 1,298 plays — up 17 percent). The song (Weezer's 12th top 10) is the second track in 2014 to vault into the top 10 in only two weeks, following **Foster the People's** "Coming of Age."

On Triple A, another former Bubbling Under act (March 8), Irish singer-songwriter **Hozier**, claims his first No. 1 as "Take Me to Church" rises 2-1. The track — Hozier's first chart entry — garnered 630 spins (up 3 percent) to bump **Sam Smith's** "Stay With Me" to No. 2 (612 plays; falling 12 percent) after a six-week reign.

"Church" is the Triple A chart's third debut hit to reach No. 1 in 2014, following "Stay With Me" and **Bastille's** "Pompeii."
