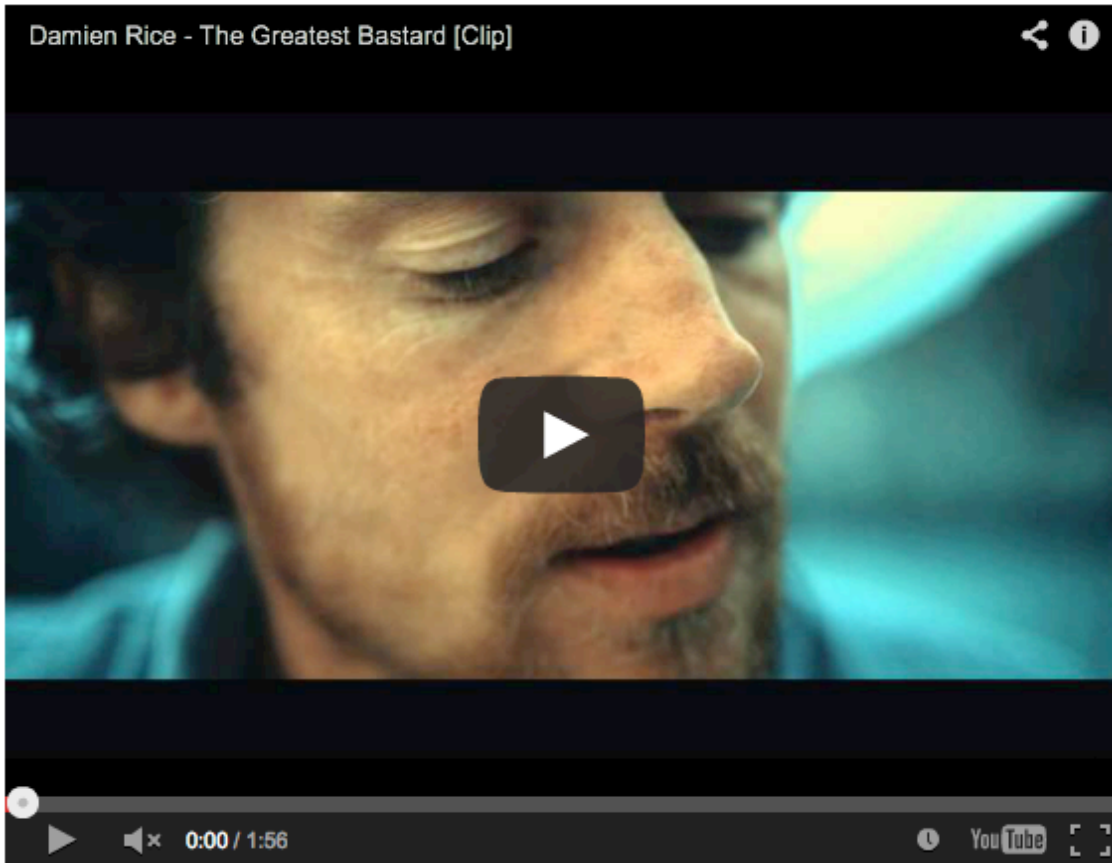

In less than two weeks, [Damien Rice](#) will return with his new album, [My Favourite Faded Fantasy](#). Produced by Rick Rubin, it serves as his third LP to date and first since 2006’s [9](#). In anticipation, the Irish singer-songwriter has unveiled a new song entitled “The Greatest Bastard”.

Much like on previous offerings [“I Don’t Want to Change You”](#) and [the title track](#), Rice reflects deeply on a relationship. However, between his hushed croon, barely-there traces of an acoustic guitar, and truly gut-wrenching lyrics (“Am I the greatest bastard that you met? The only one you can’t forget?” and “Am I just dreaming once again? Some dreams are better when they end.”), the song just might be one of his most heartbreaking works to date à la 2002’s “The Blower’s Daughter”.
